Another Indie Favorite for Teen Readers

The Wicked and the Just, by J. Anderson Coats (Harcourt Children's Books, \$16.99) "This is one of the best young adult titles I have read in a long, long time. The setting is clearly evoked, the unlikeable narrator gradually becomes sympathetic, and the message of the book is that juxtaposition of masters and servants, haves and have-nots, slaves and free, has happened throughout history and is still happening.
