The Hunting Party: A Novel, by Lucy Foley (William Morrow, \$26.99) "Lucy Foley's *The Hunting Party* is a slick, streamlined murder mystery set on a remote Scottish luxury estate. A group of old friends get together for their yearly New Year's trip, but after over a decade of closeness, some of them may be near the breaking point. Foley uses the multiple-narrator approach to distort the reader's perspective and challenge their assumptions, but it doesn't feel excessive. With multiple puzzles that come together to create the bigger picture and a short timeline that adds to the claustrophobic urgency, this novel is a devilishly thrilling winter read." —Annie Metcalf, Magers & Quinn Booksellers, Minneapolis, MN
